Town Highway Department News

Highway Superintendent David Hall reports that the roof and gable ends on the new highway department storage building are being installed. Grading of dirt roads and sweeping of paved town roads will begin by the end of this month. Residents are reminded that the speed limit in a town road work zone is 35 miles per hour. The newly purchased 2007 Freightliner dump truck with plow will be delivered by the end of this month. Effective April 7th, waste oil will not be accepted at the town landfill. Roads scheduled for paving this summer include: Beaver Street, Homestead Road, Chapman Hill Road, and Trombley Road.

Later this month the Saratoga County Farmland and Open Space Preservation Committee will be providing the Town Hall with copies of the grant application for 2007. The package includes the program criteria for eligible projects, the grant application form for open space projects and the grant application form for agriculture. The application period opens on April 1st and closes June 30th.
