The month of May finds us planting gardens and mowing lawns. It marks the unofficial start of summer and opportunities to enjoy our great outdoors. The next meeting of the Town Board is scheduled for Monday, May 8th at 7:00 p.m. Some of the items that will be covered at this meeting include: zoning officer's report, town clerk's report, supervisor's report, committee reports, consideration of a six month moratorium on Adult Use Businesses within the town, opening of bids for the town sale of a 2001 Ford Pickup truck and a 1968 Cat 951 crawler, and adoption of the revised code of the town. On Thursday, May 4th the Town Board will conduct their monthly agenda meeting at which they will review agenda items scheduled for the May 8th meeting. The town is in the process of finalizing the contract with the architectural firm of S. D. Atelier. Once the contract is signed, a timeline for phase I of the project will be developed and an analysis of the four options will begin.

The Town Park Committee continues to aggressively work at locating land and developing plans for a town park.

Highway Superintendent David Hall reports that the new 2006 Ford F350 4-wheel drive pick up truck has arrived and is in service.
