Town Hall Moves to 12 Spring Street

On Tuesday, September 30th the contents of all Town Offices were packed and moved to 12 Spring Street, the former Schuylerville High School Building in Schuylerville. Everything went smoothly and by the end of the day all items were in their new spaces. During the next two days phones and computers were connected, boxes were emptied, and offices became functional. Starting Friday, October 3rd, the town offices were open for business. The senior meals program and record archives will be moved shortly after Election Day. An open House will be scheduled in mid November.
