Supervisor Ian Murray opened the meeting with the pledge of allegiance at 7:03 p.m.

Roll call: Town Clerk Michelle Conover, called the roll: Supervisor Ian Murray - present, Councilman Michael McLoughlin – absent, Councilwoman Ruth Drumm – present, Councilman Gary Squires – present, Councilwoman Maxine Lautenberg – present.

Also present: Deputy Town Clerk Emilee M. Jones, Building Inspector/Zoning Officer Gil Albert, Highway Superintendent Ryan Campbell and other interested parties.

7:06 p.m. Councilman Michael McLoughlin arrived at the meeting.

Recognitions/Presentations/ Bid openings/Public Hearings:

Supervisor Ian Murray recognized Pat Peck and the Quaker Springs Country Kids. On April 19th, 2025 Earth Day, the kids cleaned up roadside debris along DeGarmo, Hayes and Wagmans Ridge roads. He also wants to thank Highway Superintendent Ryan Campbell and the highway crew for supplying the orange vests and garbage bags and for picking up the debris that was collected by the kids.

Secondly, Supervisor Ian Murray wants to thank Town of Saratoga Historian, Sean Kelleher and County Historian, Lauren Roberts for putting on the Turning Point Symposium at the American Legion Post 278 in Schuylerville on May 3rd and 4th, 2025. Saturday was a sold-out event and Sunday was a bus trip that retraced Henry Knox's sled trail it was very informative and a great show. Supervisor Murray stated this program certainly showcased the tourism in our area.

Teresa A. Capozzola, Esq., thanked the Town Board for giving her the opportunity to present tonight, she is requesting the Town Board adopt a resolution urging the New York State Assembly and Senate to pass the Packaging Reduction and Recycle Infrastructure Act (Senate Bill 1464 / Assembly Bill 1749). Teresa stated plastics are ambiguous and are everywhere. Water bottles take 450 years to decompose and plastic doesn't really decompose; it disintegrates and breaks down into smaller pieces and those pieces are micro plastic and nano plastic. We breath them in a form of dust, we drink them in our water and we eat them in our food. Plastics have been found in almost every organ in the human body. Recent studies have found a deceased person with severe dementia has 7 grams of plastic (equivalent to a plastic spoon) in their brain. Plastics have also been found in newborn babies. This is a crisis!

Recycling is a myth; it was promoted by the plastic and fossil fuel industries. Only 3% of plastic gets recycled in a tangible way, so we burn it and that's how it gets in the air along with other ways. No one wants a burn plant next to their home or where their children play.

New York produces 17.1 million pounds of waste per year. Plastic violates the rule of supply and demand. No one goes to the grocery store demanding it or wanting it. The plastic, chemical and fossil fuel companies make money from it and are not going to voluntarily reduce their plastic, that's a fool's errand.

There is an effort to pass the Packaging Reduction and Recycling Infrastructure Act (PRRIA). When adopted, PRRIA would:

- Reduce all packaging by 30% over 12 years
- ✤ Require 75% recycling rate for the remaining packaging by 2052

- Prohibit 17 of packaging's worst toxic chemicals and materials, including PFAS, lead, mercury, formaldehyde, bisphenols, polyvinyl chloride, polystyrene and polycarbonate
- Prohibit the harmful process known as "chemical recycling" to be considered real recycling as to a means to meeting the requirements of this bill
- Establish a modest fee on packing paid by companies, with new revenue going to local taxpayers and customers of private waste haulers
- Setablish a new Office of Inspector General to ensure that companies fully comply with the law

No one asked for all this plastic, yet we're the ones that pay the price with the most precious thing of all, our health. We need good people in leadership positions to stand up and she hopes the Town of Saratoga Town Board will be part of the solution and pass a resolution in support of this bill.
